★★Grand Procession - Update

The soft sculptures in Grand Procession will be removed next week on Tuesday, October 10, for photography for a new book. They will be reinstalled in early December.

Early Days: Indigenous Art from the McMichael Through January 6, 2024

Early Days is the first survey of Indigenous art from Canada of this scope to be presented internationally. The exhibition was organized by the McMichael Canadian Art Collection in collaboration with current Indigenous stakeholders including scholars, traditional knowledge keepers and living artists. An exhibit catalog is expected to be available in November or early December.

Substance of Stars Question: If you visit the Yupik section of Substance of Stars you'll notice that the Harpoon Counterweight ca. 100-300 CE is gone. Diana Pardue explains that... Some of the Substance of Stars loans were for just a year or slightly longer. The harpoon counterweight was only on loan for 1 year and went back to the lender. Two or three more items from Substance of Stars will be returned in April/May.

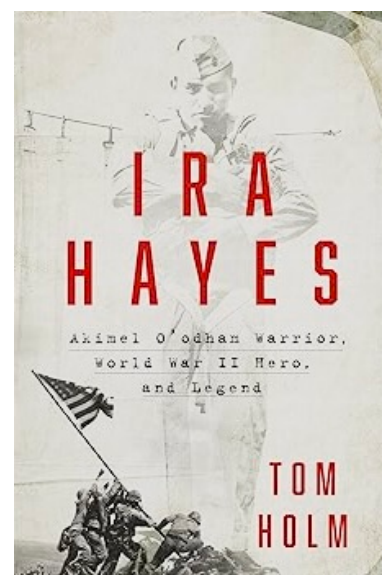
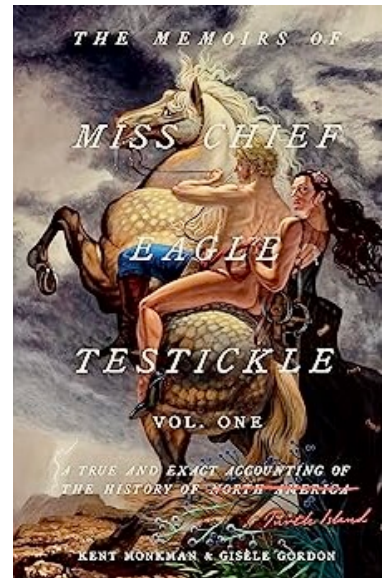
